### **Mission Statement:**

Lifebridge for Animals, Inc. is a 501(c) 3 nonprofit animal advocacy organization dedicated to minimizing the problem of pet overpopulation, neglect, and cruelty through curriculum - based humane education and spay/neuter assistance.

### **Summary of Accomplishments:**

- All Lifebridge for Animals programs were implemented by a volunteer staff. This includes a full time Executive Director, certified teacher and certified humane education specialist.
- The Lifebridge for Animals Humane Education program was expanded to include special programs for various elementary schools in Kentucky while continuing our programs in the Shelby County Public Schools.
- During 2010 humane education presentations were provided for four Shelby County Elementary Schools, Shelby County Parks Department, Bates Elementary in Jefferson County Kentucky, Eminence Independent School in Henry County Kentucky, and Shelby County civic groups.
- In April of 2009 Lifebridge donated a \$6,000 on-site spay/neuter clinic to the Shelby County Animal Shelter. The donation of the clinic made it possible for the county to provide on-site spays/neuters for all adopted animals during 2010.
- Lifebridge for Animals provided financial assistance with spays/neuters for 152 animals in the public sector during 2010. All spay/neuter surgeries were provided through Lifebridge veterinary partners at East Shelbyville Animal Clinic and Elk Creek Animal Hospital.
- Lifebridge provided 78 individual classroom presentations during 2010. All Lifebridge presentations are character based and formatted to meet core curriculum content set forth by the Kentucky Department of Education.
- Humane Education materials were presented in schools and at numerous public events. These materials included those printed in English and Spanish targeting the Hispanic community.
- A series of Public Service Announcements were aired on Disney Radio and Froggy 104.9.

- Lifebridge was featured in numerous publications such as the Sentinel News, Shelby County Life Magazine and Paula Sparrow's Creature Comforts.
- WHAS11 TV News featured the Lifebridge Humane Education program and informed the public of our annual fundraiser, which featured Humane Education, Mutt Show, Rover Run Motorcycle Ride and Show, entertainment, silent auction food and family fun.
- Lifebridge is a Better Business Bureau accredited charity meeting all twenty standards for wise charitable giving.
